

FROM THE DIRECTOR...

It is such a thrill for me to be returning to Actors Co-op after fourteen years. The very first professional play I directed in Los Angeles was Horton Foote's masterpiece, *The Habitation of Dragons*, right here on this very stage in 2005. That production was the beginning of a new chapter in my creative life. It sent me on a directing journey that has taken me far and wide and one that has been deeply fulfilling.

When Heather and the team asked me to come back to the Co-op after all this time, I jumped at the opportunity to "come home." And when the play we decided I would direct would be *Steel Magnolias*, I knew this was a homecoming that was meant to be.

We all know the beloved story and characters in Robert Harling's beautiful, funny and moving play. *Steel Magnolias* has become part of our cultural lexicon and most folks have some point of reference to the play or the film. And many can quote the fabulous lines and zingers that the ladies barb back and forth. But, for me, what has made this play an evergreen in the American theatre and beyond, is Mr. Harling's creation of a group of six unique women who rely on each other, quibble with each other, depend on each other, and need each other.

The ladies and I found early in the rehearsal process, as we were sitting around the table reading the play together, that there is an "ache" in all of these women. Their hearts are being tugged by their own unique ache and that is what pulls them to each other. They need each other.

Mr. Harling wrote this play as a reaction to the death of his sister - a cathartic, healing valentine, if you will. He wrote of what he knew. He wrote women he knew, voices he grew up with, places he was connected to. Horton Foote did as well. Because the work comes from the deepest chambers of these writer's hearts, we get to be connected to these characters. We know them and feel them and care for them. We need them.

ROBERT HARLING (*Playwright*) A Southerner, Harling moved to New York to pursue a theatrical career after first obtaining a law degree. He landed work in regional theatre and as a voiceover artist for radio and TV commercials before turning to writing. When his sister Susan died of complications from diabetes, he was inspired to write his first play, Steel Magnolias. The effort impressed Kyle Renick at the off-off-Broadway WPA Theater enough to produce it where it received strong notices and transferred to a healthy off-Broadway run. Producer Ray Stark purchased the screen rights and Harling set about adapting the piece. The finished film directed by Herbert Ross (1989) was notable for its cast: Oscar winners Sally Field, Shirley MacLaine and Olympia Dukakis, and, in the role inspired by the author's sister, Julia Roberts who gave a warm and winning performance. Harling himself played a small role in the film as the minister who presides at Roberts' wedding. Harling wrote the hilarious spoof Soapdish (1991) which re-teamed him with Sally Field, as a soap opera diva whose off-screen life was as outrageous as her onscreen one. He also adapted The First Wives Club (1996) and made his directorial debut later that same year with *The* Evening Star, based on Larry McMurtry's novel.

TERRI A. LEWIS (Costume Designer) Film designs: Landings and Sex Tax. 
