The musical runs Friday, November 1, 2019 - Sunday, December 15. Performances are Fridays and Saturdays at 8:00 pm; Sunday Matinees at 2:30 pm; Additional Saturday Matinees: November 9 at and November 16 at 2:30 pm. The theatre is dark Thanksgiving Weekend. ABOUT THE MIRACLE ON 34TH STREET: A LIVE RADIO PLAY

The film was released in 1947 with Maureen O'Hare, John Payne, Natalie Wood, and Edmund Gwenn as the primary actors. It was broadcast in 1947 as a radio production as well and starred the original cast. Since then, it has also been adopted into Broadway musical versions in the theatre, television adaptations in 1955, 1959, and 1973, and even as a puppet show at the flagship Macy's Department Store in New York.

"At one of our earliest meetings we spoke of the need for faith in something; not necessarily religious faith, but the kind of faith from which hope springs. All the characters in Miracle On 34th St., from young Susan up to Mr. Macy himself, suffer from a crisis of faith. Our job was to help them out of the dark labyrinth and shine a light on the discovery of the miracle; here less a fateful stroke of magic, but rather the result of how faith and support in your fellow human can lead to the unexpected, extraordinary joy." – Lance Arthur Smith & Jon Loren

ABOUT THE SHOW'S CREATORS

Lance Arthur Smith (Book) received his BA in Theatre with concentrations in Writing and Acting at the University of New Mexico under Emmy-winning writer Digby Wolfe (Laugh-In). His interstitial musical shorts appeared in the first three years of the University's Dionysus In The Round festival of one acts, and his plays *True Blue* and *BrushingTheCenter* (co-written with Phillip Hughes) were produced there. Commissions include *The Price of Peace* (New Village Arts) and *Miracle On 34th Street* (San Diego Musical Theatre). His play *The Two Wisemen of Las Cruces* was a Eugene O'Neill Theater Center Semifinalist and Princess Grace Award Semifinalist. Head Writer of the sci-fi pilot *Orbital Broadcast One* for TFK/Wavebreaking, he also appeared as a series regular alongside Star Trek veterans George Takei, Walter Koenig, and Tim Russ. His book *Princess Geek* was recently published, a non-fiction account of parenting a girl in the age of geek chic.

Jon Lorenz (Music & Lyrics) is a composer, lyricist, arranger and playwright from San Diego. His musical Alice was selected for the ASCAP/Disney Musical Theater Workshop and optioned by NBC/Universal Live Theatricals. He co-created the award-winning hit 80s musical revue *Mixtape*, named San Diego's longest running homegrown musical by the San Diego Union Tribune. *Oz*, An American Musical Fairy Tale received five Craig Noel Award nominations from the San Diego Critic's Circle. Commissions include *Miracle On 34th Street* and *Pump Up The Volume: A 90s-Palooza*, for San Diego Musical Theatre. His original score for *Wit* (Lamb's Players) was nominated for a Craig Noel Award. His musicals for young performers are produced nationally and available through Russell House. Since 2007, he's been the lead composer/arranger for Lamb's Players' Festival of Christmas, creating over 40 critically acclaimed original holiday songs and arrangements. JOSEPH LEO BWARIE (Director) is one of the Artistic Directors of the non-profit Garry Marshall Theatre in Burbank, California. He is a Sherman Oaks native and a recording artist popular on *Siriusly Sinatra* on SiriusXM Radio. JLB is widely known for his record-breaking turn as Frankie Valli in the Tony Award-winning musical *Jersey Boys* (over 2,000 performances - Las Vegas, 1st National Tour and Broadway). Bwarie's career began at age nine, appearing in the television series *Highway to Heaven* and *Mama's Family*. He is a longtime member of Troubadour Theater Company (recent: co-director and 'Ziggy' in *Little Drummer Bowie* and 'Octavius' in *Julius Weezer*).
