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


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WHAT IS ACTORS CO-OP?

Our history . . . Actors Co-op began on January 8, 1987, when a dozen veteran actors gathered on the grounds of the First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood to create a place for professional, personal and spiritual support. It is the first Christian-based professional theatre company in the United States. The Crossley Theatre opened in April of 1989 and the David Schall Theatre (previously named Crossley Terrace Theatre) in March of 1995.

Actors Co-op has a membership of more than fifty actors and associate artists, and is dedicated to Christ and excellence in theatre. Actors Co-op has received more than 100 awards, including the Hollywood Arts Council's Charlie Award for Excellence in Theatre Arts and the Margaret Harford Award for Sustained Achievement from the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle.

We are dedicated to pursuing the highest standards of theatrical excellence and to building up our members spiritually, personally and professionally in order to be an outreach of Christ's hope.





A TRIBUTE TO DON ROBE

WRITTEN WITH LOVE BY GREG MARTIN

Our dear friend and brother and Actors Co-op member Don Robb went to be with our Lord recently. His passing was just two and a half short months after a joyful celebration of his 90th birthday party in the Mears Center, where Don was his usual funny, irascible self. Don was, at various times -- and sometimes all at once -- a husband, a father, a pastor, an actor, an artist, an author, a teacher, a mentor, a sage, and beyond all else, a lover of God.

All of us who knew Don, especially those of us who had the pleasure of sharing the stage with him, knew him to be incredibly smart and funny and talented, always ready with a wonderfully wry anecdote, with a persistent and indelible twinkle in his eye. It was impossible not to smile in his presence. Personally, the times we spent in the dressing room during *To Kill a Mockingbird* are some of my fondest memories of the Co-op, as I sat and listened to the endlessly delightful anecdotes about his life, his youthful escapades, his family, his acting, and his time in ministry, all peppered with his comprehensive knowledge of scripture.

Don dignified the Co-op stage with his talent and his humor and his grace not only in *Mockingbird*, but also in *Translations*, *Uncle Vanya*, and *Sherlock's Last Case*. And he rarely passed up an opportunity to remind friends and fans alike that he remained the only Actors Co-op member to ever receive an Ovation Award for acting for his performance in *The Habitation of Dragons*.

I have been a member of the Actors Co-op off and on for over thirty years, and we have reluctantly said goodbye to a number of dearly beloved members of our little family over the years. But Don, as much as any who have passed before, leaves me with a feeling of something truly missing when I come into our theaters. Sort of like going into your living room and realizing your favorite easy chair is missing. Something you know will make you feel good, make you feel comfortable, make you feel at home, as soon as you feel its warmth once again. Don had a way of making you feel special, of being genuinely interested in your life, and of wanting to spread joy, that would inevitably set the perfect mood for performing or rehearsing or just fellowshipping with other fellow actors. And above all, Don never stopped loving to make people laugh. That, as much as anything, was his gift and his ministry. I continued to enjoy that gift long after Don stepped away from the Co-op, as we would meet on occasion for coffee, and I would once again be regaled with stories and jokes (*many of which I had oft heard before*), and lessons on life and love and the Lord. He was creative almost to the very end, still writing short stories, drawing sketches, sharing cartoons he had created, even planning for a one-man show.

If ever a cliche met a man, and vice versa, it was Don and the words, "He lived life to the fullest."

Of course, his dear wife Judy, with whom he shared a wonderful love affair, and his beloved family, will miss him the most. But we all feel his absence. But God, in his infinite wisdom, has billions of threads which he is weaving into his majestic and holy, and infinitely good, tapestry. And the best I can figure is that heaven must occasionally have transfers and promotions, and the vitally important job of Chief Raconteur and Greeter at the pearly gates recently came open. God asked the angels for recommendations, and the vote was unanimous.

They say that to live forever is to live in the hearts you leave behind. Don lives -- and laughs -- in our hearts.

I have no doubt the largest audience he has ever had is laughing at his anecdotes and jokes right now.



MY CO-OP STORY

Being a part of the Actors Co-op has shaped my life significantly over the last six years. It is a true community of artists that tell powerful stories, engage and minister to our audiences, and support each other personally and artistically. FROM THE DIRECTOR...

It's the most wonderful time of the year – so say the lyrics made famous by singer Andy Williams. Many hold tight to that concept. Some revel in their spiritual life and the pageantry of the season. Others find comfort in the tradition of baking and gathering and sitting at large festive tables. And some anxiously await the aisles of stores that shockingly display holiday "cheer" as early as September, joyfully adding to their own display of decked halls.

It's that time of year when everyone you meet does have a bigger smile, a more generous approach or even a kind word. For a brief period, there are fewer angry drivers honking to make their left hand turn, there are less impatient customers waiting in line, there are more random acts of kindness, and there are more eyes face-to-face and less dependence on our screens.

And then just a few days after the New Year, the horns start honking, the frustration in line creeps back, the fight over a parking space is fair game, the casual obscenity shouted from one person who doesn't like what another person is doing is back in full force, and the seasonal kindness is a thing of Christmas past.

But maybe in some way, in some small form, we could. We could extend our belief in whatever we hold so dear to us at Christmas time, and carry it throughout the year. Just a little.

This is not a new idea. 'Tiny Tim' knows it. 'Cindy Lou Who' knows it. And it takes some time, but little Susan Walker in our story also ends up discovering that believing works, kindness matters, and generosity is best when abundant all year long.

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
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
